Copyright is a legal right created by the law of a country that grants the creator of an original work exclusive rights for its use and distribution. This is usually only for a limited time. The exclusive rights are not absolute but limited by limitations and exceptions to copyright law, including fair use. A major limitation on copyright is that copyright protects only the original expression of ideas, and not the underlying ideas themselves.[1][2]



Formal Semantics & REL Evaluation

- ➤ Analyse license terms for semantic equivalence / similarity / ambiguity (i.e. distribution)
- ➤ Evaluate semantic expressivity of Rights Expression Languages to represent license terms

License Representation


- > Represent licenses in RDF using ODRL + extensions
- Contribute to W3C Permissions & Obligations Group

Rule Engine

- > Create rules to reason over RDF statements to
 - ... calculate similarity of licenses
 - ... detect conflicts between licenses
 - ... provide hints to conflict resolution

Data Provision & Publishing

- > Provide API to enable "DALICC as a service"
- ➤ Provide endpoints to retrieve (linked) open data from DALICC (i.e. RDF licenses)
